

**REGULATIONS OF THE FARMERS MARKET
OF CLOVIS, NEW MEXICO**

1. All produce must be grown within a 60 mile radius of Clovis. Any exceptions must be approved by the Board of Directors. You must fill out an application for membership.
2. Grower/seller agrees to allow a member of the board of directors or their representative to inspect their farm to assure all produce is home grown by the grower/seller.
3. Any grower/seller may be suspended from selling by action of the steering committee for failure to comply with the regulations of the Clovis Farmers Market.
4. All produce must be at least one (1) foot above the surface of the selling area.
5. The market encourages farmers to offer samples of their produce for tasting. For sanitary and insurance reasons, all utensils must be kept disinfected with a bleach and water solution.
6. All farmers shall wear clean outer garments and shall keep hands clean.
7. All stands, including vehicles used for produce transportation, must be kept clean and free of old produce.
8. No animals or fowl shall be allowed or kept in the immediate sales area.
9. These are the foods you can sell at the market: Fruits, vegetables, herbs, grains, dry beans, dried fruits and vegetables, ground chili, and sprouts, eggs must be refrigerated and labeled as ungraded, wheat and white bread only for baked goods. The only non-food items allowed to be sold at this market will be cut flowers, potted plants or bulbs, fowl, fish, meat, prepared salsas and jams (proper license).
10. Handmade crafts made by persons from the above counties are permitted to sell (each farmer must have business license issued by the City of Clovis.)
11. The premises of the market shall be kept free from litter and rubbish. Each seller will be expected to clean his/her space before leaving the area.
12. No sleeping or expectorating (spitting) allowed on the premises.
13. All vending facilities shall be removed at the end of each day.
14. For safety, no unauthorized vehicles will be allowed in the sales area to pick up produce.
15. Farmers participating in the WIC program agree to abide by all rules and regulations set by that program. You can only take WIC cards for produce listed on the list sent out by WIC. The DO NOT list includes chicos, posole, jam, jellies, ristras, honey and another processed foods, maple syrup, cider, nuts, seeds, eggs, meat, cheese, and seafood.

16. All growers/sellers must use only NMDA approved scales if selling produce by the weight. (If you don't want to buy an approved scale, you must sell by count, number, bunch, or volume.)
17. All growers/sellers are free to set their own prices.
18. Daily permits will be available to eligible growers who are not members subject to the regulations of the market and a fee of the following:

Daily Fee: \$11.00
Seasonal Fee: \$107.00
(Fees are subject to change.)

New farmers/sellers will have two market days at \$11.00 per market to decide if they want to pay the seasonal fee or just continue to pay the daily fee.

19. Sale days are Tuesdays, 4:00 p.m. and Saturdays, 8:00 a.m. Farmers are not allowed to begin selling until they are instructed to do so.
20. Farmers will receive a verbal warning the first time they sell before notice. The second warning will result in that farmer leaving the sale for that day, forfeiting their market fees paid for that day. The third warning will result in the farmer not being allowed to participate in the Farmers Market for the remainder of the season, also forfeiting any market fees paid in advance.
